So in keeping with my theme of “Memories of a Professional Squash Player” I would like to touch on the transition time of squash from Amateur to Open.

As a young Professional in 1978 one of the great thrills I was looking forward to was to play with Geoff Hunt in the Australian team in 1981. The game went Open in 1980/81 but the ISRF (International Squash Rackets Federation) wanted to run the 1981 world teams event in Sweden as an Amateur event so all the top world 16 ranked pros boycotted the event thus ruling out any chance I ever had of playing in a team with Geoff!

Sadly, Geoff retired in 1982 so he never played for Australia again. The championships in Sweden were recognised as an official world title event as was the last one played under that banner in 1983 in NZ. The difference in 1983 was there was prizemoney and points. So Jahangir and the rest of the world played this event as well as the World Open held in Germany. So two world titles in 1983!! A bit like the first ever World Open which was the British Open in 1976/77 which Geoff Hunt won ... two titles in one! The World Open was then played every year at a new venue .

So it was a confusing time for us players. Sometimes we forget this transition period which in my humble opinion was not handled well by the governing bodies at the time. So good to see it now all sorted out.

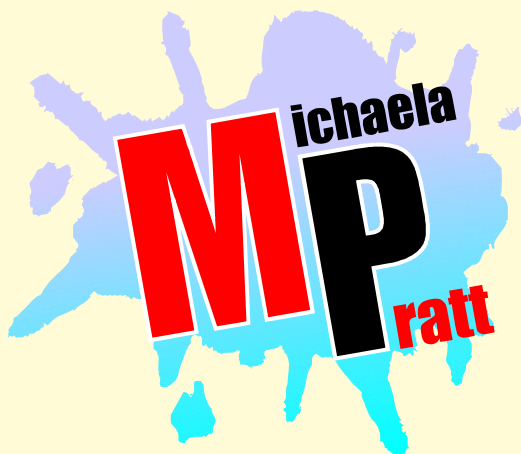

There was a bittersweet feeling for the WA contingent heading off to the 2019 Australian Junior Championships, as this was the first year in many that we would not be officially sending our state team. 12 players with racquet bags, thermals and families in tow made the jump across the Strait to downtown Devonport to compete in one of only two platinum tournaments in Australia. Being grand final weekend, the planes were full and ironically given the Tassie flavour there were Tigers everywhere.

Results wise, the Westerners punched well above our weight class, with the lowest position any of us finishing was still in the top 10. Greg Chan (who still counts himself, and we proudly claim as a WA-er) and Oscar Curtis certainly proved how good they were.

Both playing out of their age-groups to finish Runner-up and 4th respectively, in the U19 age group! With Oscar having the honour of taking the only game off eventual winner Jacob Ford.

Isla Harris came up against her nemesis Maja Maziuk for the second time, and unfortunately lost in 4, giving Isla a second runner up finish at the highest level.

Dylan Classen (U17), Caitlin Pratt (U15) and Hannah Slyth (U13) all finished in 3rd place. Great results for these awesome players and a perfect reminder of the depth across age groups of the West Aussie kids. Kiran Byles continues to improve his placings, Isla Mac, Remi Young, Sterling Slyth and Erin Classen also all had strong finishes.

Of course, as well as squash there was sightseeing to be done, and mountains to climb (literally) with some people going go-carting, hiking and visiting the local beaches... which were all rocky, are you allowed to call it a beach if it doesn't have sand?

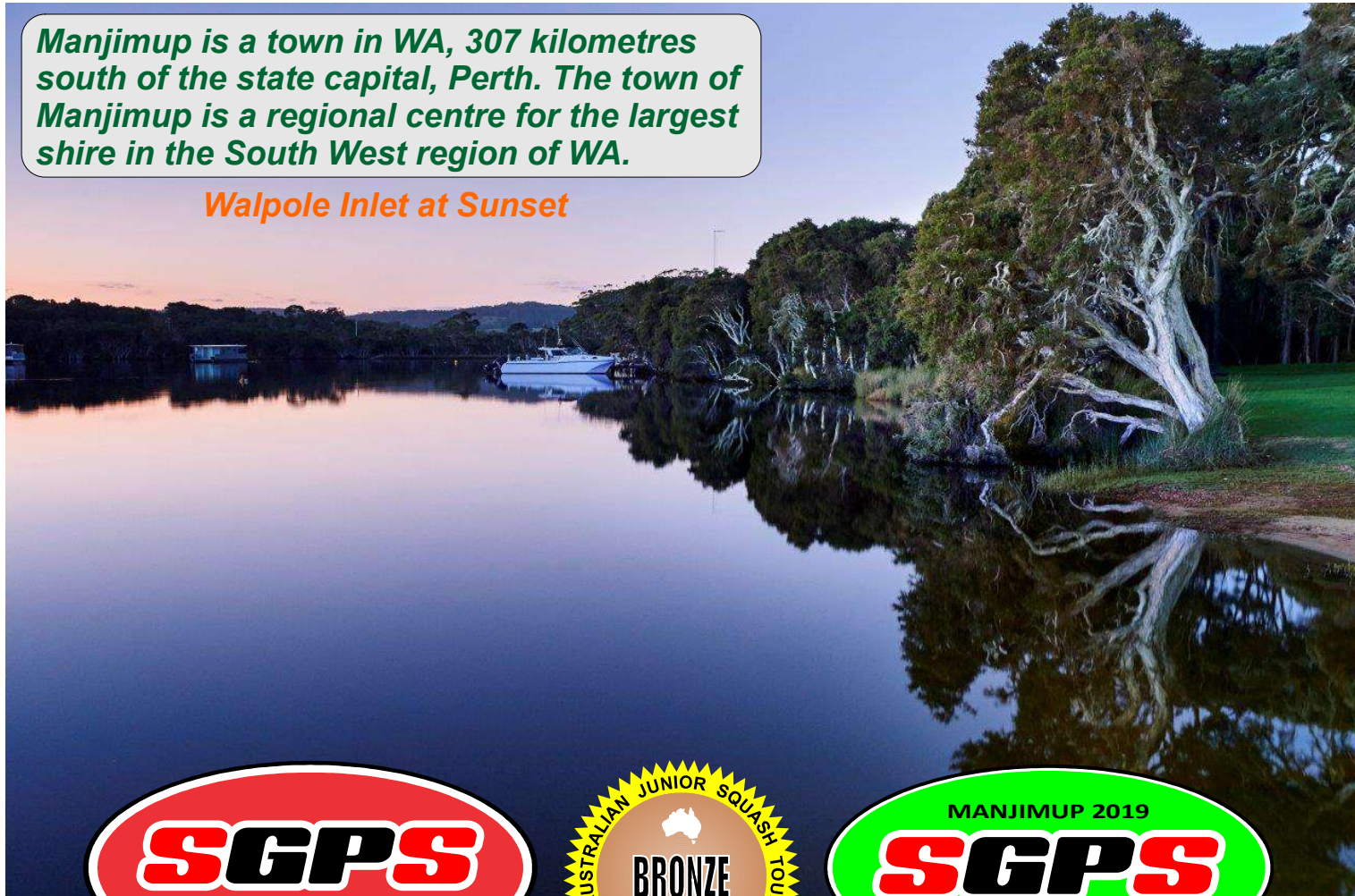

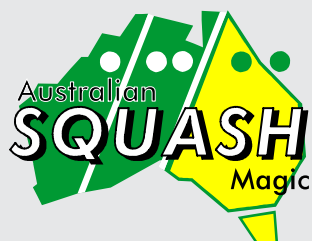

MASTERS TRANS TASMAN TEST SERIES

The Anne Richards and Sue Hillier Report.

We arrived in Christchurch on Saturday 12 October and had an enjoyable drive to Timaru through some lush, deep green countryside.

The Aussie team were all close together in three houses with us and four other girls in one house. This was a great experience, great camaraderie, team talks, tactics, laughter and fun.

A quick hit was organised on Sunday to get used to the courts, two of them had wood panelled back walls, and of course the grey front walls. The two test series courts had different height ceilings and one was faster than the other.

We learned that the Timaru Squash Centre was the oldest squash centre in New Zealand and the staff couldn't have been friendlier.

Leading into our first test we were treated to a traditional Maori welcome along with the Kiwi players and all supporters.

This was a fantastic way to start the series, it was a real honour organised by the Timaru council. We were sung in by Maori elders and the Haka was performed by local Maori school girls who also sang traditional welcome songs with amazing, powerful voices.

The National anthems and team photos followed and here you could see the camaraderie between the teams. With all that finished, Anne was first on the live streaming court and very nervous, wanting to get Australia off to a good start. She settled down well and beat her fit opponent Karen Walton in 3.

Sue played on the other court against Kay Newman, she was also nervous and quickly realised that Kay was an experienced tactician on court. Sue called on all her knowledge to also win her first test in 3.

With their matches over Anne and Sue were able to watch everyone else fight to win, with a bit of coaching as well. It was great to see, there were some 5 setters and sore, tired bodies - but most importantly, a win to Australia 11 matches to 3 on the night.



MASTERS TRANS TASMAN TEST SERIES

Tuesday was the second test with Anne and Sue both having a win, however some of the other matches results were reversed. Australia won the second test 10/4. Ice baths followed for some players from both sides after two tough days of squash with a well deserved rest day on Wednesday.

On the rest day Anne and Sue travelled south to Omaru through some beautiful country side with some others in the team.

Thursday was the final test and although we had won the series no one was willing to let their guard down. Everyone tried hard, again several match results were reversed and both Anne and Sue continued their streak with wins. Australia won the final test 11/3.

The next day was straight into the individual championships. The organisers had a major blimp when two planes with a lot of competitors were stranded at their respective airports. The organisers did an amazing job reorganising schedules quickly to keep the tournament on track.

Anne won her individual O60 title against Karen Walton 3-0 and Sue went on to win the O55 title over Katherine McKay 3-0. Overall Australia won 8 titles, a result to be proud of.

WA Masters Squash AGM

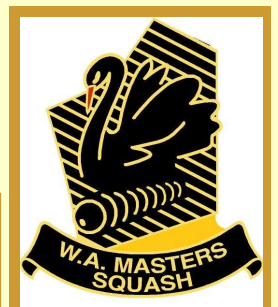

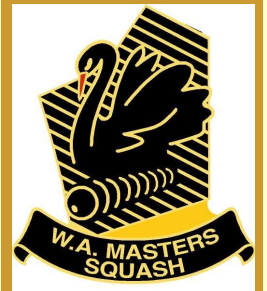
End of year function

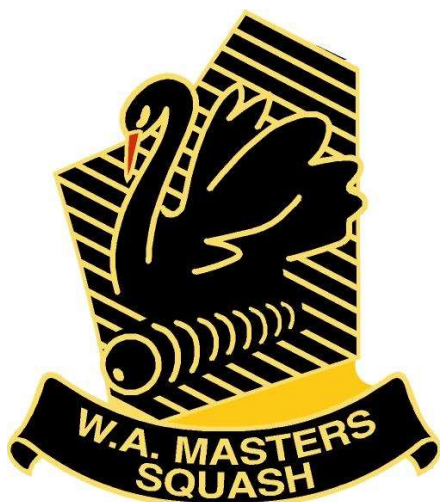
